

Blue Star Memorial Happenings!

Blue and Gold Star Memorial Chairman Nancy Moore continues doing an outstanding job in promoting and coordinating The Blue Star and Gold Star Memorial program for GCM. Two Blue Star Memorials were dedicated last Fall.

The long-awaited installation at the Sonny Montgomery Veterans Center on the campus of Mississippi State University was completed, with the dedication held Oct. 18. The MSU President and Vice President of Student Affairs participated in the ceremony, along with the center's director and Garden

Clubs of Mississippi officers. A reception followed in the Veteran's Center. This memorial is one of only a few that are located on college campuses in the US.

The next dedication was Nov. 11 in Tylertown, where the Walthall County Board of Supervisors and Walthall American Legion Post #56 purchased the memorial in coordinated efforts with GCM. Tylertown boasts a large percentage of veterans compared to the town's population and asked GCM to work with them in purchasing and dedicating the memorial.




